## **DESCRIPTION OF CONCERTS**

Concerts with Michael Reimann are characterized by his experience gained all over the world where he has met lots of other musical personalities. He does not use any electronic aids – everything is played and sung live. The audience usually listens silently and attentively even to very soft tones as for example played on the Japanese bamboo flute Shakuhachi. Apart from the classical piano the instruments played are mainly natural: feelers, Jew's harp, water drums, chamois horns, gongs, fling pipes etc. Special attention is paid to the natural overtone scale.

The piece „Kalimba Dance“ is quite remarkable as Michael Reimann is playing on two instruments at the same time while he is moving through the audience. A „biological dynamic dolby surround event“ without electric current. It can be heard on a CD with the same name.

He keeps surprising his audience like for example the latest innovation with pebbles: title of the piece is „Steinzeit“ (Stone Age). The element water like for example achieved with African water drums or Indian sound bowls adds to very special acoustic phenomena.

In the Hospitalkirche Stuttgart this is an extraordinary concert performance as it is celebrated with candle light.
